TRANSFORMING TO A CIRCULAR FASHION INDUSTRY THROUGH EDUCATION

We at Redress have been working for over a decade to drive growth towards a circular fashion system. We believe learning and awareness is the first step of any change, and that by equipping the next generation of fashion professionals with the right information and tools, a critical shift in the fashion industry is possible.

The Redress Design Award, the world's largest sustainable fashion design competition now celebrating its 10th cycle, is key to achieving this vision. Education has formed the core of this multi-layered programme from the onset: from our home in Asia, we have delivered circular and sustainable design content online and

in person to more than 50,000 individuals since the inaugural cycle catalysing positive change.

Our unique approach has also led to many extended opportunities for educational impact, including close relationships with select universities to deliver content directly to students across the globe; consultations with IFA Paris (France) and The Hong Kong Polytechnic University on Fashion Sustainability curricula; and the integration of our educational content into courses at multiple academic institutions.

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VF aims to inspire designers as together we champion the move toward a circular economy. Our hope is [the Redress Design] Award equips emerging designers with the skills and knowledge needed to turn the fashion industry on its head, leading us towards a more sustainable future.



EUROPE



With an initial focus on Asia, over the years our work has expanded its reach to now truly global audiences. Our strategic industry partnerships and unique positioning in Hong Kong – a hub at the heart of the world's manufacturing region - has enabled us to shine light on the innovation and progress that is happening here, whilst supporting a vital exchange of knowledge within the region and across the world.

Our educational activities span three main methods of delivery designed to spark interest, support self enquiry, develop critical skills and techniques, and drive systemic change through educational institutions across the world. They include:

SELF-LED LEARNING THROUGH OPEN ONLINE RESOURCES

Our multilingual LEARN content continually evolves to address current sustainability topics in this rapidly changing industry. We provide a variety of downloadable resources and videos for educators and students, working to bridge the gap between the level of sustainability education typically provided by fashion universities and the growing needs of the industry - and nurturing the skills needed to transform it.





10,000+ people visit the LEARN platform annually, with educational videos seeing 95,000 views in total



1,100+ individuals from 78 regions have utilised the Educator Pack, a resource of ready-to-use teaching materials launched in 2016

TAILORED EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

We facilitate knowledge exchange and enable interactions with a wide range of fashion stakeholders. Over 200 online and in-person educational events have been conducted across the globe, reaching predominantly students and educators, but also select professionals across the fashion supply chain. Most recently, in 2020 we launched an online Circular Fashion

Design Pathway Course to support designers in submitting high-quality applications for the competition as well as increase general subject understanding. This course will continue to be an integral part of future cycles.

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IMMERSIVE HANDS-ON EXPERIENCES

In the lead up to the competition finale, all Redress Design Award finalists undergo an intensive educational 'boot camp', including a series of intensive design and business challenges in partnership with industry that provide an opportunity to apply circular and sustainable design strategies to real-life scenarios. In doing so, the designers gain deeper understanding of the topics and techniques as well as the importance of recognising different stakeholder perspectives when they apply them.

EMPOWERING EDUCATORS

The Redress Design Award Educator Pack, launched in 2016, was created to empower educators to offer sustainable and circular design content, thereby extending our educational reach beyond our organisation's physical capacity. In addition, after consultation with educators and students with varying levels of knowledge in sustainable fashion, we uncovered an overwhelming and urgent need globally for resources to support educators in integrating sustainability into the fashion curriculum.

Now five subjects strong, the pack is made up of lecture content, exercises and project briefs. To date, over 1,100 individuals from 78 countries and regions have utilised the pack. An impact assessment conducted earlier this year revealed that by engaging with educators through this pack, we have increased the circular fashion content taught in fashion curriculums globally.

Though not originally intended for use outside the classroom, we have also witnessed a high demand for this content from industry professionals (32% of downloads), who are equipping themselves and team members with circular fashion knowledge via our pack.

Alongside the pack we also run a number of educator workshops each year, with the dual purposes of developing our work by understanding the needs in sustainability education in relation to the local context, and providing a forum for educators to share their challenges and successes. Industry speakers are also invited, with the aim to create synergies and spark collaborations with our educator attendees.

Educators use our pack in: Design related module (49%) Non-design related module (30%) Sustainability related module (21%)

Most of the respondents (77%) use the content from the pack because they were looking for supplementary information to what they know in sustainable fashion

(77%) agree the pack has inspired them to include sustainable fashion content in their teaching

(88%) agree the pack has enabled them to deliver sustainable fashion content in an engaging way to students

(85%) strongly agree the pack has saved time in their planning and teaching

(66%) have already and (31%) will recommend it to colleagues or other educators

Educator Pack Impact Assessment

Exposing the European and US educators to case studies of best practice in Hong Kong and Mainland China is an advantage. It helps educators see the global picture, and how other countries are tackling the impacts of fashion in their region. The sustainability discourse is at times dominated by voices from the West so the Redress Educator Pack is a refreshing and important contribution to the field.

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DRIVING THE VISION FORWARD

In this, our 10th cycle, we conducted a consultation to assess our own impact and the current and future needs of design educators helping to shift the industry toward circularity. Our findings indicated that educators pushing for more sustainability and circular fashion education still experience lack of support from institutions and colleagues. The review also identified a critical need for platforms enabling knowledge exchange, latest research findings and best practices.

Design will shape the fashion industry's transformation to a circular economy, and Redress' open source learning materials are important resources for engaging designers directly.
